In 2021, it will take place on Saturday 26 June.

Armed Forces Day celebrations begin on Monday 21 June when the Armed Forces Day flag is raised on buildings and famous landmarks around the country.

North Somerset Council will be showing its support for Armed Forces Day by flying the Armed Forces Day Flag from our buildings at Castlewood and the Town Hall. Watch out for it it is a very distinctive white flag with a representation of the Union Flag on its upper half.
