



HOLY SAVIOUR CHURCH PUXTON ROAD PUXTON

This wonderful grade 1 listed 13th century gem was declared redundant in 2002 and is administered by the Church Conservation Trust.

However, the graveyard is still in use as a consecrated site and its upkeep falls to the Parish under the jurisdiction of our vicar at St Andrews Church Congresbury.

The Parish Council have been vexed for some years that the graveyard has become overgrown and is not resourced for regular maintenance. A parish Councillor organised a clear up some 18 months ago, but, recently, residents have been distressed that their family graves are becoming undermined by animals.

The Parish Council agreed to fund strimming during July and August 2019. During this year a Parish Councillor has been in discussions with the Vicar to see if a regular programme of maintenance can be established preferably via volunteers, as happens in Congresbury. We hope to see some strategy in place by spring 2020 to bring this very special site up to a standard to match that of its parent Church, which is so admired by residents and tourists alike.

In the meantime a group of volunteers have had blitz Saturdays and really got to grips with clearing the brambles and other rampant overgrowth. They have been doing wonderful work and, judging by the photograph below, seem to have rather enjoyed it!!
