

BROADBAND

Gigaclear, contractors to Connecting Devon and Somerset to supply our fast broadband, are experiencing delays. Post the collapse of main sub-contractor Carillion, we have no firm revised timetable for them supplying our Parish.

Truespeed offer an alternative, and potentially the most hassle-free way to get what we want - fast and reliable broadband.

Vitally, supply via Truespeed depends on how many of us sign up for the service. We need around 30% of our homes to sign up before Truespeed can commit to bringing in their service which, uniquely, offers fibre to the home via leases on Western Power and BT poles rather than via underground excavation. There is no up front cost. Consumer commitment is to a £120 one-off installation fee (with the first essential 30% of registrants getting this free!) and an 18 month fixed price contract at £47.50 per month, which includes



broadband at a full 200mb/s, up and down (potential for 1000mb/s), and a telephone line, which can carry the customer's existing telephone number. The school and Village Hall are provided with a free service.

In signing up, you commit to taking the Truespeed service, only so long as they provide that service within 6 months of your sign up. We need as many sign-ups as possible to get us on the Truespeed work schedule. Near neighbours, Kenn, went through this process and are now likely to 'go live' with Truespeed within the year - so the more people who sign up, the sooner we can expect to receive a genuinely fast broadband service. Election Day, when we will be voting for our choices to represent us on North Somerset Council and on Puxton Parish Council.



There are some 9,000 civil parishes served by parish councils run by elected, unpaid councillors. They were established by the Local Government Act 1894, and modified principally by the Local Government Act 1972 and the Localism Act 2011. As the first tier of local government they provide a wide range of services from allotments to tourism. The National Association of Local Councils describes Parish Council activities as representing the local community, delivering services to meet local needs, and improving the

quality of life and community well-being. Fulfilment of these activities flows from Parish Council meetings, of which there must be at least four a year, including an annual meeting in the spring. Our Council can have seven members, one of whom acts as Chair. Meetings are open to the public and agendas and minutes are published on the Council website. There is a part time Parish Clerk who, as the servant of the Council, is paid to keep the wheels turning and make sure projects, communications, and administration are kept on the boil. The Council currently meets on the first Thursday of each month except August. In May there is an Annual Parish Meeting: this is a meeting of residents, not a Parish Council meeting.

Meeting agendas can be very busy and sometimes fairly thin, but there are always a range of issues that relate to, and command the concerns and ambitions of, the Parish. Parishes are funded via a "precept" (collected with the council tax). Traditionally precepts have to cover staff costs, maintenance or replacement of assets such as seats and noticeboards and the funding of elections. These days Parish Councils are increasingly expected to fund projects for which they must make long term provision; not easy when government is also putting pressure on them to limit the sizes of their precepts.
