### 10 ONGOING ITEMS BEING MONITORED BY CLERK

Puxton Lane Grip in hand via area officer.

**Puxton Rd/Lane junction:** sign re-siting on job list... but in queue. **Wick Lane:** Gully outside Manor Farm floods. Update report due. **Wick Lane Rail Bridge:** damaged road signs on both sides - update due.

Maysgreen Lane: road sign and finger post at Puxton Rd damaged: on job list for repair.

Maysgreen Lane Cheese Factory 'temporary' edge repair on job list.

**A370 Footpath:** More effective flailing of hedges being pressed for - to optimise width between curb and hedge. Clearance of footpath to gain width for wheelchairs is an acknowledged but unaffordable need - the result of NSC neglect over many years.

Puxton Rd Drainage at Wyndham Grange: on job list.

Council Houses Gully 30metres jetted Sept 23rd: still not clear. CCTV survey booked.

New Oldbridge River Bridge: Timetable due

A370 Central Refuge: On current year job list. £4300 expected to be PPC contribution from this year's capital budget.

**Puxton Rd 30mph/Puxton Road/Lane Triangle Re-Engineering:** The speed check (around 42mph average) did not trigger NSC involvement in funding a speed limit. Triangle re-engineering is envisaged to be removing the triangle, widening the verges on either side (to include re-siting the finger post), and thereby narrowing the Puxton Road access - effectively forming a 'village gate'. This would maintain the sense of Village while optimising the safety of junction. A 'wild guess' at £30,000 for the total project puts it into the realm of strategy, rather than medium term possibility, given the current financial conditions of both the Parish Council and NSC.

## 103/19 OTHER MATTERS

Holy Saviour Church: Cllr Redding reported that there had been further community work done to clear the hedges and edges, and that more is planned. To gauge the extend of the grass maintenance problem Cllr Redding did an initial strim to get the grass down to a manageable height, and Tim Beacham has done a fortnightly strim during July and August. Each strim is a full day's work and the costs for July and August were noted as due for payment per Minute 105/19 below. The meeting was reminded that Holy Saviour Church itself is in the care of The Churches Conservation Trust (visit https://www.visitchurches.org.uk/ for details, which includes a detailed calendar of 'what's on' activities and events that provide much food for thought). Because the churchyard is still an operating burial ground it is the responsibility of the Parochial Parish, which falls under the jurisdiction of St Andrew's Church in Congresbury. For this reason, Cllr Redding is liaising with the Vicar to establish an affordable way of ensuring a long term maintenance programme. St Andrews has a rota of volunteers (from a population some 14 times larger that that of Hewish & Puxton) to care for its churchyard. Volunteers, contributions from extant families with plots in the graveyards, contractor maintenance (the trimming element of this would cost £1500 based on cuts fortnightly between April-September), fund raising events, or a mixture of all these and more are under consideration. The possibility for some budgeted contribution form this Council was also mooted. Cllr Redding undertook to progress her discussion with the Vicar and report progress back to Members.

**Wyndham Grange Lights:** might be better angled to avoid dazzling traffic. The lights are off the road and only come in when activated from within the yard. Cllr Howard will take up with the complainant. **Policing:** PSCO reports that there has not been a spate of burglaries, just the one mentioned in July.

**Puxton Road/Puxton Lane junction:** becoming increasingly unsafe, prompting calls for action. See earlier Minutes as under:

#### June 2018 - Minute 74/18

**Traffic Management at Puxton Lane/Road Triangle:** The speed of current traffic poses a potentially serious danger to drivers. We have an old fashioned country triangle that used to be accessed cautiously from all directions. Today it is increasingly a rat run for preoccupied and urgent commuters. A collision - especially from those turning towards the bridge and those coming from the bridge into Puxton Road - is sure to happen eventually. Is there some form of one-way system that can be clearly signposted such that traffic can be both clearly managed through this hazard and can clearly understand the potential danger of it? Clerk to investigate and report back.

#### July 2018 - Minute 82/18

**Traffic Management at Puxton Lane/Road Triangle:** NSC suggest that the only solution to mitigate the danger issues, would be to do away with the triangle and have an ordinary junction (the finger post to be re-located). The meeting felt this would be too drastic an alteration that would have a negative impact on the essentially 'village' character of the area around Holy Saviour and the Village Green. They agreed that no further action be taken, but that the situation be monitored.

Members remain concerned that removing the triangle will despoil the essential village character of this spot that includes attractive properties, the village green and Holy Saviour Church. Clerk to go back to NSC and follow up on signage and traffic management options (including a 20mph or 30mph speed limit) that might achieve calmer and safer driving profile and a more secure environment for non-driving road users and residents.

Wick Lane Rail Bridge Road Signs: damaged signs on both sides have been reported to NSC.

Daytime hirers have been warned that the hall will not be available during these repairs, which it is essential to get done before the winter sets in. (Clerk's note: It must be noted that, beyond the immediate cash available from the Hall Fundraising Account, the urgent need of these repairs has led to some £5000 being underwritten by a family within the parish - for which we must, of course, be hugely grateful).
