013/24 PUBLIC SESSION

RE THE BARN NEXT TO OAKACRE OF A370: 24/P/0320/LDP (see minute 015/24 below) relates to this barn having permission to be converted to a domestic residence. The owners are seeking to expand the footprint of the barn to a size that will accommodate their granddaughter and her children, who have been forced away from the parish due to a lack of suitable family accommodation being available. It has long been the view of the Parish Council that this parish will die if current rigid policies against the provision of housing for its young people continue to be adhered to. The space provision here is being prepared for presentation to NSC as a planning application for appropriate enlargement by the demolition of the existing barn and its replacement by a building appropriate to the needs of a local family. Every Councillor was in agreement that the right and decent thing to do will be not to dismiss the anticipated application out of hand, but to consider it within the context of the community future this parish is so urgently seeking to ensure. The ethos that drives the Parish Council's concerns are to be expressed by the Clerk to the the agents acting in this anticipated application.

017/24 PARISH MATTERS

- i. Triangles at Puxton Village and Wick Lane: Painting the tarmac surrounding the Puxton triangle has been a success, albeit the turning into Puxton Road from the Oldbridge River direction still needs extreme caution.
- ii. A370. Signage and Speed Issues:
 - a) Police DCB (data collection box) erection awaited via our local police contacts. An approach to the PCC re this and motor cycle speed checks outside St Annes School referred back to the DCB deployment and the need for an analysis of its subsequent results before any further action by the police could be considered.
 - **b)** A grant application is with NSC re the purchase of a SWARCO Speed Indicator Device (SID); if successful, we would purchase a SWARCO SID. NSC highways have given clearance for fixing to signposts along the A370 and along Puxton Lane, Puxton Road and Maysgreen Lane. We are waiting for NSC Street lighting to agree.
- **iii. Publicity Flyers:** Various flyers can be distributed to households over the coming months as and when they are available:
 - (a) Fly-tipping: Village Agent these two are ready for printing and circulation.
 - (b) Wind Turbines: Clerk to research availability of NSC policy suitable for a flyer.
- **vi. Littleton Steel:** Cllr Redding explained the concerns of residents to the owner, who undertook to monitor and improve the situation within the bounds of operational necessity.
- vii. Dolmoor Lane Fly-tipping: The Clerk has contacted NSC. A response has been awaited from the responsible NSC officer. Clerk to chase.
- viii. Turning right into Maysgreen Lane from the A370 from WsM: The road markings here are confusing. When first reported, NSC deemed it too expensive to put the matter right. This council has brought the matter to NSC's attention again, but their non-response seems to confirm an intention to leave the situation as it is until the road becomes due for re-painting.

020/24 COUNCILLORS' REPORTS

Cllr Butterfield

Potholes: There are an increasing number of bad potholes along the lanes, some of which are becoming dangerous. Many have appeared and grown recently due to the exceptionally heavy rains. The Clerk said that he has had confirmation from NSC that they are concentrating on getting these filled over the next few weeks, with area officers marking them up for repair and repairs having been done in some places.

Removal of Post Box by the Green in Puxton Road: This happened on February 1st with no prior notification to residents. The Clerk undertook to see if an explanation was forthcoming from Royal Mail.

Cllr Redding

ALCA Chairmans' Meetings: Cllr Redding attended the first of these Zoom sessions and may attend the next one. Whilst there is a lot to learn, much of it revolves around matters that do not tend to involve such a small Council as Puxton.

Vexatious Complaints: Yet another complaint on an historical matter, that has been thoroughly dealt with, has come in via the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO). It will be dealt with in the usual way.

Smashed Glass Thrown into Hall Car Park: The periodic throwing of glass into the car park seems to have abated, as the police were informed of each event and appear to have taken some positive steps to deter it from happening.

Obstructive Parking in East Hewish Lane: A report has come in that some half a dozen large vehicles - believed to belong to residents staying at The Full Quart - are parking down the side of the Pub and impeding traffic flow down this narrow section of road. The reporter said they approached the pub's owner asking why the vehicle were not parking in the very large car park, but claims that they did not get a satisfactory response. Whilst there is not a restriction to parking on this section of highway, it is an offence to do so in a manner that impedes the proper use of the highway by other users. The problem will be monitored.
